### **ADMINISTRATION**

The City of Rolla operates under the Council-Mayor-Administrator form of government. The elected body consists of Mayor Lou Magdits, IV and 12 City Council members responsible for the creation of ordinances and policies. The Mayor is elected for a four-year term and council members for two-year terms. Six of the 12 City Council members are elected every other year.

The City Council meets on the first and third Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, (901 N. Elm Street). Council meetings are televised live and rebroadcast on Rolla Channel 16. City Administration, which also consists of the City Clerk, is open Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. To run the day-to-day activities of the City, the City Council hires a City Administrator who is responsible for the City's entire operation, including the city-owned Rolla National Airport. ### **ROLLA NATIONAL AIRPORT**

Rolla National Airport, which includes a newly developed Industrial Park with high-tech manufacturing firms, is located 13 miles north of Rolla on Highway 63. It is situated on more than 1,300 acres with two runways, each over a mile in length. There is a lounge and adequate parking for pilots and passengers along with aircraft fuel, tie-downs and hangars. There are also commercial and industrial sites available for development.

The airport serves general aviation, including private, corporate and commercial aircraft. Rolla National Airport links Rolla with a worldwide business and academic community bringing in corporate executives doing business in Rolla and the surrounding areas, government officials, those involved in the University's numerous business and social activities, as well as private transient aircraft and contract airfreight services. ### **FINANCE**

The Finance Department handles all of the City's financial, insurance and risk management activities. Functions of the department include general accounting, accounts payable and receivable, billing and collections, payroll, investments, and business licensing. The City's Management Information Systems Division is also part of the Finance Department, as well as Human Resources.

The Finance Department office is the point of payment for various transactions with the citizens of Rolla. Payments are accepted by cash, check or credit card. All business licenses, peddler's permits and liquor licenses are issued through this office. The City does not impose a personal property tax, a charge for dog licenses nor require automobile stickers.

The largest revenue source for the City of Rolla is sales tax. Rolla collects over \$9.2 million per year to support the General Fund, Street Fund, and Parks Fund.

The Rolla Fire and Rescue Department headquarters is located at 1490 East Tenth Street with office hours from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday. The City has an Insurance Services Organization (ISO) rating of Class 2. The Department has 30 paid personnel, two pumpers, one 100-foot aerial platform, two 75-foot aerial trucks, one 105-foot ladder truck, and a state-of-the-art 37-foot Mobile Command/Communications Center. The Department receives ongoing in-house training, as well as state certified Hazardous Materials and Homeland Security training.

Rolla Lions Club provides regional fire training facilities at their 4.5-acre training facility located at the Rolla Lions Club Park. The Department's second fire station is located at 400 West Fourth Street adjacent to Eugene Northern Community Hall. www.rollacity.org/fire-home.shtml

## REFUSE & RECYCLING SERVICES

The Environmental Services Department provides weekly collection of garbage, recyclables, and yard wastes for all city residents. The City provides containers for residents' trash and recyclables. Residents provide their own biodegradable paper bags for yard waste.

The Community Development Department is responsible for the preparation of the Comprehensive Plan and related elements, including research and statistical analysis. Staff advises and supports the Planning and Zoning Commission, Board of Adjustment, Board of Building Appeals, and City Council on rezoning requests, subdivision plats, annexations, variances, building code interpretations, and other development requests within the City. The Department is also responsible for the enforcement of the City's building codes/nuisance ordinances with the issuance of building permits, development inspections, and nuisance abatements. Department staff assists with affordable housing programs, neighborhood and downtown revitalization efforts, comprehensive redevelopment initiatives and managing the Rolla Enterprise Zone.

The Planning and Zoning Commission is composed of nine voting members who meet the second Tuesday of each month at 5:30 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers. Rolla Municipal Utilities (RMU) provides electricity and water to homes, businesses and industries in Rolla. RMU operates under the direction of a four-member Board of Public Works comprised of city residents appointed by the Mayor and approved by the City Council. As a financially self-supporting entity of the City of Rolla, no taxes are used for the operation of RMU as all department operations are financed through electric and water revenues. As a locally owned and operated utility, RMU provides its consumer-owners with an efficient, reliable service at the lowest possible cost.

Service requests for connection or disconnection from the electric and water system are accepted Monday-Friday from 8:00 – 5:00 p.m. by either stopping by or calling the Rolla Municipal Utilities Business office located at 102 West 9th Street. Service

Connect forms are also available on the RMU website. RMU requires the following minimum deposit for Residential service: (Electric) - \$240: (Water) - \$60.

Commercial deposits are equal to the highest two consecutive billing months (actual or estimated) and are determined on an individual basis. Deposits are either refunded upon termination of service or held for a period of five years and returned (provided a good payment record has been established).

### **PARKS**

The Parks Department oversees the maintenance of all City parks and the City's cemetery. The department maintains 270 acres of park and cemetery land. The park land is divided into 34 parks. The City has within these parks rental pavilions, numerous playgrounds, baseball fields, softball fields, soccer fields, lighted tennis courts, batting cages, pickleball courts, a 9-hole newly updated disc golf course, and a standing locomotive and passenger car which were donated by the Frisco Railroad Company in 1955 and completely renovated in 2020. The Department also operates Splash Zone Water Park open seasonally, and oversees the Skateboard Park.

The Parks Department also maintains the 40-acre Rolla Cemetery. The cemetery was incorporated in 1861 and includes the Weber family cemetery, which dates back to the 1850s. It is located at the corner of Highway 72 and Rolla Street.

In addition, the Department oversees the usage of Eugene Northern Community Hall, which is located at 400 West Fourth Street next to Fire Station #2. With 3,000-square-feet of space available for rental, seating capacity is 100 for classroom style and 150 for auditorium style.
